FIERCE HEAT PERSISTS; TOLL OF DEATH GROWS


Baltimore Less Torrid Than Sister Cities: Slight Hope Of Relief Soon.

3 DEAD HERE; SCORE PROSTRATED

Many Fatalities Reported In Other Cities Of The Country—New England Scorches Under Temperatures of 100 to 104 Degrees.

The remarkable heat wave that has covered the northern part of the United States from the Kockies eastward for several days still persists, with little, if any, prospects of relief in the next day or two at least.

Baltimore, hot as it was here, was the coolest city on the North Atlantic Seaboard, with the single exception of New York, where there was, officially, 3° less torridity.



Exodus 7:14-18 (ESV): "Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Pharaoh's heart is hardened; he refuses to let the people go. 15 Go to Pharaoh in the morning, as he is going out to the water. Stand on the bank of the Nile to meet him, and take in your hand the staff that turned into a serpent. 16 And you shall say to him, "The LORD, the God of the Hebrews, sent me to you, saying, 'Let my people go, that they may serve me in the wilderness.' But so far, you have not obeyed. 17 Thus says the LORD, 'By this you shall know that I am the LORD: behold, with the staff that is in my hand

I will strike the water that is in the Nile, and it shall turn into blood. **18** The fish in the Nile shall die, and the

Nile will stink, and the Egyptians will grow weary of drinking water from the Nile.""


