


2030 (28% of the elderly).

In the community, older victims of sexual abuse were violated most often by spouses/partners.



In facilities, employees responsible for care (43%) or other residents (41%) were most likely offenders.


Ramsey-Klawsnik, et al., (2008).

Elders who experienced abuse, even modest abuse, had a 300% higher risk of death when compared to those who had not been abused.











Guiding Our Work

18

- A guiding principle "guides an organization throughout its life in all circumstances, irrespective of changes in its goals, strategies, type of work, or the top management."
- Minimum guidelines "recommend practices that allow some discretion or leeway in interpretation, implementation, or use."
- Practice strategies are practical suggestions for how to implement the guiding principles and minimum guidelines.
