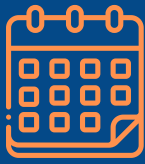

## Wade Brost, MSW, LICSW, FACHE, LNHA, LALD

Executive Director

Mental Health & Substance Abuse Treatment Services, MN Direct Care and Treatment

### **BACKGROUND:**

**Q: Tell us about your current role and what it entails.**

**A:** I am the executive director of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Treatment Services in Minnesota's state-operated behavioral healthcare system. I provide strategic and operational direction to all state of MN run hospitals, intensive residential treatment services and substance use disorder treatment programs. This includes overseeing operations of all departments, including health care services, finance, human resources, and facility operations. Other duties include developing, implementing, and evaluating the division's strategic plan; ensuring compliance with health care, financial, and staffing laws and regulations; hiring and retaining qualified staff; ensuring the best quality of patient care; demonstrating leadership; and creating a positive and productive workplace culture.

**Q: Tell us about your journey into healthcare administration.**

**A:** I started my healthcare career in direct practice, serving as a crisis counselor, social worker and therapist prior to becoming an administrator. Early in my career I was very fortunate to work with a great mentor who valued servant leadership and developing others and an organization that focused on succession planning.

At every turn, I was coached to think about leadership as a way to serve more people in addition to those on my caseload, challenged to accept new opportunities – and new responsibilities – when offered, and allowed to learn valuable lessons by making mistakes along the way.

I'm a healthcare leader today because of the time, talent and trust that others so generously invested in me; the opportunities they gave me to grow and develop; and the confidence they showed in my abilities and the patience they showed when I made mistakes.

**Q: What prompted you to pursue a career in healthcare?**

**A:** Some people are destined for healthcare. They're inherently driven to move in that direction. They hear the calling and answer. For me, it was more of a happy accident. I was guided into the field by a series of mentors who recognized – and nurtured – the potential in me long before I saw it in myself. I'll always be grateful for their guidance, and I hope to do the same for many others during my career.

**Q: What have you enjoyed most about the roles you have held?**

**A:** I've really enjoyed the opportunity to serve in both direct care and leadership roles. The knowledge and experience I've gained from the bedside to the C-Suite have made me a much more rounded leader. Being a direct care worker allowed me to experience meaningful connections with patients, provided invaluable insights into how care should be delivered, and granted me the privilege of witnessing recovery and healing firsthand. As a leader, I take pleasure in knowing the strategy, resources, support and guidance I provide to our teams is helping to drive incredible outcomes for the many people we serve.

## **CONNECTION TO ACHE:**

**Q: How long have you been a member of ACHE?**

**A:** Since 2017 (8 years)

**Q: Why did you decide to join ACHE MN? Any advice for those thinking about joining ACHE?**

**A:** I wanted to join a network of healthcare leaders who focus on collaboration and continuous learning and leadership development. My advice is to join and get engaged in the networking and educational opportunities. You never know who you will meet that will help change and shape the trajectory of your career.

**Q: What do you gain most from your ACHE membership/participation?**

**A:** ACHE has provided me with a network of people to collaborate with and educational opportunities to support continuous learning. Being a Fellow has provided national recognition as a knowledgeable and experienced healthcare leader.

## **MENTORSHIP:**

**Q. Did you (or do you) have a mentor that played a role in your navigating your career?**

**A.** I've been privileged to have a few mentors during my life. Their guidance and support during challenging and good times in both my personal life and career have been instrumental in shaping me into the person I am today.

**Q. What stands out as some of the most important lessons your mentors have taught you?**

- A.**
- Service first.
  - It's OK to fail, as long as you learn from it.
  - Always be learning.
  - Assume good intent from others. Bring good intent to others.
  - To make decisions based on values, not personal gain. I guess you'd call that integrity.

**Q. Why did you decide to pursue your Fellowship certification?**

**A.** Working toward and maintaining Fellowship aligns with my personal expectations of leadership. A leader should be knowledgeable, experienced, and committed to leadership development and service to our communities and industry. Being a Fellow is one way to demonstrate this.
