Pamela McNutt has been in the field of healthcare information technology for 32 years, the last 21 of which in the role of Chief Information Officer (CIO). She has worked for Medicus/HBOC, Hermann Hospital and is currently the Sr. Vice-President and CIO with Methodist Health System in Dallas, Texas.

Ms. McNutt has served as a Director on the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) national Board (1998-2001), on the College of Healthcare Information Management Executives (CHIME) as a Trustee (2007-2009) and as Chair of the Healthcare Information Systems Executives Association. Pam serves a Director on the Methodist McKinney Medical Center Board.

Pamela is a fellow in CHIME and HIMSS. She was awarded the John Gall CIO of the year award in 2002, the HIMSS Leadership award in 2001 and the HIMSS Information Systems award in 1998. She participated as faculty in the CHIME Healthcare CIO Boot Camp 2003- 2006, served as Chair of the CHIME Advocacy Leadership Team (2008 - 2009) and Chaired the CHIME Policy Steering Committee (2009 – 2011). Modern Healthcare named Pamela one of the Top 25 Women in Healthcare in 2011 and she was named as “56 Women Hospital & Health care Leaders to Know” by Becker's Hospital Review magazine.

Pamela continues to work to shape national Healthcare IT policy as member of the CHIME Policy Steering Committee and the American Hospital Association Healthcare IT advisory committee. She serves on the Texas Health Care Information Council for the Texas Department of Health, the Texas Health and Human Services Commission Electronic Health Information Exchange System Advisory Committee, and the North Texas Accountable Care Partnership HIE committee. Pamela is a frequent speaker on the topic of the implications of the ARRA HITECH incentives and HIPAA regulations.

Hubert Zajicek, MD, MBA, is the CEO & Co-founder of Health Wildcatters, a healthcare seed fund and accelerator in Dallas, Texas. Health Wildcatters provides mentorship, capital and guidance up to 12 healthcare related startups during an intensive 12 week program which culminates in a pitch day annually. Health Wildcatters three funds are invested in over 30 healthcare startup companies.

Dr. Zajicek has extensive experience in startups and is an active speaker, panelist and thought leader on healthcare innovation, startups, entrepreneurship & financing. He serves as advisor, mentor and board member on various organizations and startup companies. He was managing director-medical technology at NTEC (North Texas Enterprise Center), where he ran what eventually became the Southwest's largest medtech investment conference, showcasing startups that attracted in excess of \$300M.

Prior to this he was on the faculty at UT Southwestern, as an NIH funded principal investigator in the Departments of Internal Medicine and Cell Biology. He is president and founder of the society of Physician Entrepreneurs – DFW Chapter, co-founder and partner of Lone Star Angels and is on the board of the Southwest Venture Forum. He is an MD from the University of Vienna and has an MBA from SMU's Cox School of Business and is a member of several professional organizations.

Billy is an accomplished author and speaker. Billy is recognized as one of the world's most respected experts on emerging threats related to Industrial Control Systems (ICS), Critical Infrastructure (CI), and, medical devices. He discovered thousands of security vulnerabilities in hardware and software supporting ICS and critical infrastructure. He has been publically credited by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) over 50 times for his support to the DHS ICS Cyber Emergency Response Team (ICS-CERT). Before Qualys, Billy was a Lead at Google where he led the front line response for externally reported security issues and incidents. Prior to Google, Billy was the Security Program Manager at Internet Explorer (Microsoft). During his time at Microsoft, Billy led the company's response for several high profile incidents, including the response for Operation Aurora. Before Microsoft, Billy worked as a penetration tester, an intrusion detection analyst, and served as an active duty Marine Corps Officer.

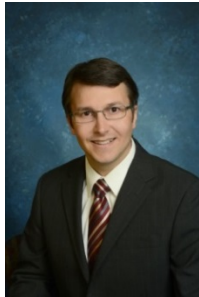
