Brett D. Lee currently serves as the Chief Executive Officer of the Dallas Market, which includes oversight of the Lake Pointe Health Network, Centennial Medical Center, Doctor's Hospital at White Rock Lake, and Texas

Regional Medical Center. In addition to managing the operations of the four acute care hospitals, Lee also has oversight for the 19 ambulatory locations in the market that serve a population of over 900,000 residents of the north and east Dallas suburban communities.

Mr. Lee has spent 15 years in the healthcare industry as a clinician, clinical leader, and executive. A majority of his career has been spent in pediatric healthcare, serving in executive roles at 4 of the nation's top 10 largest children's hospitals. Mr. Lee is the lead author of the bestselling book *Growing Leaders in Healthcare: Lessons from the Corporate World,* published by the Health Administration Press, and the subsequent American College of Healthcare Executives self-study course *Creating a Leadership Development Program in your Healthcare Organization.* He then went on to publish two additional books, *Managing Clinically: What can Medicine Teach us About Leadership,* and *Voices from Riley; a Collection of Prayers from a Top Children's Hospital.*

Mr. Lee holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Physical Therapy from the University of Oklahoma, a Master of Health Science Degree in Health Finance and Management from the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health, a Master of Science in Leadership Development Degree from the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School of Business, and a Doctorate in Allied Health from the Massachusetts General Hospital Institute of Health Professions.

In 2011, Mr. Lee was given the Robert S. Hudgens Memorial Award as the national young healthcare executive of the year by the American College of Healthcare Executives (ACHE), was recognized as a "Rising Star" of the healthcare industry by *Becker's Hospital Review* in 2012,2013, and 2014, and was named as an "up and comer" by *Modern Healthcare* in 2013. In 2014, the *Dallas Business Journal* named Lee as one of their "Who's Who in Healthcare".
