*Taller de la mañana | 10:00 – 12:00 Encendiendo el Crecimiento* | Mary Eldridge facilitará una conversación acerca del duelo, la capacidad emocional y cómo desarrollar un balance entre las responsabilidades de nuestras vidas. Mary (ella/she) es una Venezolana que ha vivido en los Estados Unidos por unos 10 años. Mary actualmente trabaja como terapeuta para estudiantes de UW-Madison que han sufrido violencia doméstica y/o sexual. Durante esta presentación hablaremos acerca del impacto del trabajo que hacemos así como también usaremos estrategias para combatirlo y/o reducirlo y así encontrar un balance saludable y manejable.

*Taller de la tarde | 1:00 – 3:00 Temas Calientes de Inmigración* | Lia Ocasio es una abogada de inmigración para Centro legal RISE. Lia tiene amplia experiencia trabajando con inmigrantes y sobrevivientes de violencia que abarca ocho años. Antes de llegar a RISE, Lia trabajó como abogada en el Proyecto de defensa de Inmigración en los Servicios Legales de Queens (QLS, por sus siglas en inglés) en Nueva York, donde proporcionó representación legal a clientes inmigrantes con solicitudes de la visa U, VAWA, ajuste de estatus, asilo, y naturalización. En el clima político actual, los que trabajan con inmigrantes deben mantenerse informados sobre los varios cambios en las políticas de inmigración que afectan a los inmigrantes. Lia hablará sobre estos cambios que han sucedido recientemente, incluyendo: solicitudes y los tiempos de procesamiento bien largos, DACA, "cargos públicos" y beneficios públicos, las amenazas de redadas, detención, y deportación. Hablaremos también sobre el efecto de estos cambios en las vidas de los inmigrantes, los remedios disponibles, sus derechos en este país, lo que puede hacer cada uno.

### **Foundations of Advocacy**

This training is designed for new domestic abuse and sexual assault advocates. For two days, participants will gather to review DV dynamics, trauma, counseling basics, and advocating within systems. We will practice advocacy skills and self-care during this interactive training.

*Registration:* Space is limited, so register early! Registration will be closed early if capacity is reached before the deadline; preference will be given to advocates of DV/SA programs.

*Cost:* \$75. The preferred payment method is a credit card at registration. Refunds will be issued, less \$10 for administrative fees, for cancellations received in writing by November 5, 2019.

*Lodging & Meals:* Morning refreshments and lunch will be provided. A block of rooms at the Sheraton is available for November 11-13, at the state rate of \$82 per night. ## **Basic Restraining Order Training**

At the Basic Restraining Order Training, participants learn how to help a victim assess whether they want a restraining order, explain the process to obtain one, determine eligibility for different types of orders, assist a victim to complete a petition and to prepare for court. Recent legislation related to restraining orders will also be covered. This training follows the Foundations of Advocacy at the Sheraton Madison.

## **Identifying & Serving Human Trafficking Survivors at Domestic Abuse Programs**

Different systems focus on different aspects of trafficking; one system cannot adequately address the problem and no services are designed to meet all the needs of trafficking victims. How do domestic abuse programs fit into this picture? Today we are at the beginning stages of an ongoing conversation.

During this training, explore the intersections of domestic abuse and human trafficking. Presenters include Morgan Young (Office of Crime Victim Services, WI Department of Justice) and staff of the Asha Project, Waukesha Women's Center, UMOS Latina Resource Center, and End Domestic Abuse WI. We will come together to review tools and resources, and consider real-life case scenarios of trafficking survivors who worked with Wisconsin domestic abuse programs. See the event flyer for additional details. This will be the first of two events for advocates; in 2020 we will meet in north-central Wisconsin.
