### Chaplaincy Outreach

Nursing homes visits were made to 604 residents with outreach to 60 different facilities. Seventeen parachaplain volunteers donated 594 hours through friendly visits and/or assistance with observance of Jewish holidays.

### Child Abuse Prevention Program

1,150 presentations were made to 26,460 children, parents and teachers (representing 39,690 family members) introducing personal safety skills and prevention information focused on keeping children safe from sexual abuse and exploitation.

### Clinical Services (Including FMHC and BISC)

Families received 5,520 counseling sessions, representing 19,320 people, addressing issues focused on: abuse, depression, anxiety, interpersonal relationships, mental and physical illness, marital conflict/divorce, bereavement, parent-child relationships, school behavior and social skills.

### School Based Social Work Services

Consultation, mental health-focused educational groups, crisis intervention and brief counseling services were provided to 1,329 children, families and educational staff in the Jewish Day Schools, public schools, congregational pre-schools, camps and at the Jewish Community Center.

### ElderLink St. Louis

Information and referral services were provided to 1,737 older adults and their family members through telephone calls and website visits. 210 individuals participated in 16 community education programs. 77 GateKeeper trainings reached 351 individuals.

### Financial Assistance

247 families, representing 403 people, received financial assistance to help with short term crisis situations due to unemployment, under-employment, high medical or utility bills or other unexpected expenses.

### Harvey Kornblum Jewish Food Pantry

9,077 families, representing 36,308 people, received more than 2,400,000 food and personal care items from the food pantry. There were a total of 129,033 visits (including deliveries) to the pantry in 2014.

190 volunteers donated 17,912 hours of service to the HKJFP through assisting clients, stocking shelves, sorting goods, registering new clients and more.

### In-Home Services for Older Adults and Adults with Special Needs

158 individuals received a total of 27,844 hours of in-home services.

193 individuals received 1,102.5 hours of assistance provided by 154 volunteers through the Volunteer Money Management Program in partnership with Lutheran Senior Services.
