SUBMIT PATIENT VIDEO CASE FOR THE PRESENTATION COMPETITION (submission is optional)

SESSION GOAL: Allow participants to observe how a panel of experts approach challenging or complex patient cases.

Although the main aim of this exercise is educational, the top presenter will receive a complimentary registration to attend the 2024 MDS Congress in Philadelphia, PA, USA.

Case submitted **must** have a known diagnosis or it will <u>not</u> be considered.

CASE SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Use of the provided PowerPoint template is required
- 2. Presentations cannot exceed 10 minutes in length
- 3. Cases must have a known diagnosis. This diagnosis is not shared with the audience until the end of the presentation.
- 4. Please submit presentations via wetransfer.com and enter the email astoffel@movementdisorders.org, when prompted.

CASE PRESENTATION FORMAT REQUIREMENTS:

- SLIDE 1*: Introduction statement of why the case is unique or of interest and what is the known diagnosis.

 *This slide is for review purposes only.
- SLIDE 2: Title of the case (do not use the diagnosis in the title of the case), your full name and name of institution, city, state and country
- SLIDE 3: Patient history/brief summary of case
- SLICE 4: Patient examination
- SLIDE 5: Imbedded video cannot exceed 30-45 seconds in duration
- SLIDE 6: Audience discussion: Phenomenology, Differential diagnosis, Investigations
 SLIDE 7: Polling question for audience (create multiple choice A-D, only one is correct)
- SLIDE 8: Differential diagnosis
- SLIDE 9: Known diagnosis and relevant review of the condition
- SLIDE 10: Take home lessons
