PASTOR TO PEOPLE

ANNUAL MEETING


Sunday October 25 at 11:30am via Zoom

New Birth

Who needs it? (vs. 1–3)

- From the most religious and moral to the very least, we all must be “born again.”

What is it? (vs. 4–5)

- To be “born again” is to have a brand new, recreated spiritual life.

Who does it? (vs. 6–8)

- “New birth” is the work of the Spirit alone and it is totally beyond our control.

How does it come? (vs. 9–14)

- We are “born again” as we look in faith to Christ alone.

Why do we need it? (vs. 16–18)

- “New birth” in Jesus is the only antidote for the venom coursing through our veins.

What is in the way? (vs. 19–21)

- To be “born again” the only thing we need is nothing; but it’s the one thing most of us don’t have.

Takeaway: Look to Christ and Christ alone!

MISSIONS MOMENT



Przemek and Julie Hybel serve with International Messengers in Krakow, Poland. They work in many areas of local church ministry: evangelism, discipleship, youth ministry, translation, women's ministry, and biblical counseling.

As Poland went into lockdown in March due to COVID, the Hybels' ministry multiplied. Julie met via video with women of all ages, providing counseling, one-on-one Bible studies, group Bible studies, and encouragement calls. Przemek reached out to men, led weekly youth meetings, and translated online services. Both continued to teach English as an outreach tool through Zoom. They are continuing all of those activities both online and in person.

Right before the lockdown, Julie organized a women's retreat focused on the theme of overcoming fear, worry, and anxiety. She shared a story about how God helped equip the women to face the difficulties of COVID-19: "Just days before the retreat, I felt God strongly leading me to put a stronger and repetitive emphasis on His

immense love, comfort, and provision for us when facing the unknown. I had no idea that everybody's futures would suddenly become so unknown! Many ladies lost jobs and businesses, and many have had health issues. I've heard testimony after testimony of how God used that teaching to prepare them for these circumstances."
