3. ACCEPTANCE OF FINANCIAL REPORT

Kristyn Sanchez reviewed the income statement, balance sheet and the financial memo. 4. IMPO FINANCIAL CONTRACTS

Anna Gremling introduced the IMPO financial contract for approval. The first contract discussed was for Ice Miller. The firm is utilized to review bills and engage the State House as needed for the 2026 legislative session. The cost is \$60,00 (100% locally funded) with an end date of 12/31/26. It was asked is there would be any rate changes and noted there would not be for 2026. It was also asked about a 30 day opt out possibility if the new arrangement does not work out for the IMPO. Anna Gremling stated there would be no rate changes because it’s a lump sum contract, and there is an opt out built into the contract. Next was the discussion on the contracts with Burgess and Niple, who will work with the IMPO on bike and pedestrian plan updates in both Whitestown and McCordsville. Finally, the EBP contract was presented. This contract is to evaluate the impacts of the IndyGo Red Line six years after the start of operation.

Anna Gremling stated elections are coming up for the Executive Committee in February. Anna stated she would notify the committee if there were any other participants interested in filling the role. There will be a ballot vote at the policy meeting in February.

7. Conflict of Interest

Anna Gremling stated the IMPO has received several of the signed forms via email. She would reach out to any of those that are still missing.

Anna Gremling notated a change of venue for the next Transportation Tech Committee meeting, which will be held at the Indiana Historical Society on February 4th. IMPO Certification Review will be happen with FHWA, FTA, and INDOT in mid-April. Certification is done every four years, and with changes at the federal level there is more uncertainty than in years past.

There was a brief discussion of legislative bills 1001 and 1101. INDOT has paused several projects for 1-2 years, but the list is not public yet.

Re: Financial Statements

Revenue

- 2026 IMPO Local Membership dues were sent to all LPAs in early September. Follow-ups were sent in early January and February.
- The IMPO received 75% of its SFY 2026 annual allocation in Federal Funds Exchange dollars from INDOT on September 9th.
 - o The remaining 25% of the 2026 annual allocation is expected to be available to the IMPO in Q1 2026.

Expenses

- First SS4A grant invoice for 4th Qtr 2025 expenses was submitted and approved by FHWA.
- There are only 6 projects left in the READI - 180 Alliance region that have not sent us claims for 100% of the funds they will be able to spend. These claims total \$1.7M.
- In READI - 70-40, we are down to two projects that have not hit 100% disbursed.

Resolution Bundle 2026- EXEC-002 includes the following resolutions, which enable the Executive Director to enter into agreements with vendors for products and services as described:

A. Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. – Speedway 16th Street Planning Project

- a. An agreement for a study that will investigate road diet strategies, dedicated bike lanes and non-vehicular paths.
- b. RFP Process
- c. Total Cost: \$125,000.00 (\$100,000 / 80% federal funding and \$25,000 / 20% local match provided by the Town of Speedway).
- d. Term extends to 12/31/26.

B. Taylor Siefker Williams Design Group – Active Transportation Plan

- a. An agreement that will provide an update to the region's existing Active Transportation Plan using current data and stakeholder input, revise and strengthen the project scoring methodology.
- b. RFP Process
- c. Total cost not to exceed \$250,000. \$95,192 will come from IMPO Complete Streets funding that is 100% federal. The remaining \$154,808 will be split \$123,846.40 (80% Federal Planning Dollars) and \$30,961.60 (Local Dues Paid by IMPO Membership).
- d. Term extends to 12/31/27.

C. Lochmueller Group, Inc. – 146th and River Road

- a. An agreement to study the intersections to evaluate existing conditions, no build traffic operations and evaluate 3 interchange alternatives.
- b. RFP Process
- c. Total cost not to exceed \$150,000. IMPO will contribute \$94,720 of Federal Planning dollars, and Hamilton County will pick up remaining funds as local match.
- d. Term extends to 12/31/27.

D. Statara – 2026 Central Indiana Community Preference Survey

- a. An agreement which is the next iteration of the long-running MPO-MIBOR housing preference survey.
- b. Special Purchase
- c. Total cost not to exceed \$54,000. IMPO will contribute \$19,500 of Federal Planning dollars, and MIBOR local funding will be \$34,500.
- d. Term extends to 12/31/26.

SECTION 1: That the Executive Director is approved and authorized to negotiate and enter into the contracts and agreements listed in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

SECTION 2: That any prior action taken by the Executive Director or any staff necessary in connection with the item or items approved herein is hereby ratified and adopted as actions on behalf of the IMPO.

SECTION 3: That any officer, including but not limited to the Executive Director of the IMPO, and each of them, is authorized and empowered to take any and all action necessary and to execute all agreements, instruments and other documents, in such form and as each of such officer(s) considers necessary or desirable to effectuate the foregoing resolutions and to carry out the purposes thereof; the taking of any such action and execution of any such agreement, instrument or document to be conclusive evidence of the due authorization thereof by the Executive Committee of the IMPO.

SECTION 4: This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.

CONTRACTS AND ENGAGEMENTS

KIMLEY-HORN AND ASSOCIATES, INC. – SPEEDWAY PLANNING PROJECT

To negotiate and execute an agreement with Kimley-Horn for a study of the Speedway 16th street corridor. Amount not to exceed \$125,000.00 utilizing 80% federal funds provided by the IMPO (\$100,000) and 20% local funds provided by the Town of Speedway (\$25,000). The agreement extends to December 31, 2026.

TAYLOR SIEFKER WILLIAMS DESIGN GROUP – ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

To negotiate and execute an agreement with Taylor Siefker Williams to update the region's existing Active Transportation Plan. Total cost not to exceed \$250,000. \$95,192 will come from IMPO Complete Streets funding that is 100% federal. The remaining \$154,808 will be split \$123,846.40 (80% Federal Planning Dollars) and \$30,961.60 (Local Dues Paid by IMPO Membership). The agreement extends to December 31, 2027.

LOCHMUELLER GROUP, INC. – 146TH AND RIVER ROAD

To negotiate and execute an agreement with Lochmueller Group to study the intersection and evaluate existing conditions, no build traffic operations and evaluate 3 interchange alternatives, for a total cost not to exceed \$150,000. IMPO will contribute \$94,720 of Federal Planning dollars, and Hamilton County will pick up remaining funds as local match. The agreement extends to December 31, 2027.

STATARA – 2026 CENTRAL INDIANA COMMUNITY PREFERENCE SURVEY

To negotiate and execute an agreement with Statara, for the next iteration of the MPO-MIBOR housing preference survey. The total cost is not to exceed \$54,000. IMPO will contribute \$19,500 of Federal Planning dollars, and MIBOR will pick up remaining funds of \$34,500 as local match.

The agreement extends to December 31, 2026.
