**3. ACCEPTANCE OF FINANCIAL REPORT**

**Kristyn Sanchez** reviewed the income statement, balance sheet and the financial memo. It was notated the IMPO has received 75% of its SFY 2026 annual allocation in Federal Funds Exchange from INDOT. The remaining 25% is expected to be available to the IMPO in the coming weeks. The PL for 2025 has been spent down and funds from 2026 PL are now being utilized. HWC is working to close -out READI 1.0 funding for Central Indiana with reallocation plans. Reimbursement requests for SS4A and EPA grants, including staff time are continuing to be submitted. It was mentioned there have been no discussion regarding federal highway redistribution figures and how they may affect the current 2027 annual allocation. In the past week the IMPO has received final 2026 TIP numbers and an increase of \$4M will be seen from 2026 to 2027.

**4. 2026 Budget Amendment 1**

**Sean Northup** discussed as part of routine operations, the IMPO will periodically modify or amend the Unified Planning Work Program and budget. The resolution before you is to modify the budget, and we plan to modify the UPWP at the end of the calendar year. There are 3 key factors for the amendment. The first is a personnel update, one staff member left the IMPO, and a new staff member was hired at a different salary. Secondly, there is a MIBOR local match. MIBOR secured more National Association of Realtors grant money, reducing the IMPO amount on the Central Indiana Community Preference Survey by \$20,500. The final factor is changes to various planning efforts. This includes adding support and staff training for the new call for projects methodology, adding staff presentation training, tolling modeling, and consulting. Some budget lines, such as the IMPO Strategic Plan and IndyGo Onboard Survey, are reduced to reflect actual costs.

**6. READI RESOLUTIONS**

**Anna Gremling** introduced the READI information for the resolution. The first item was for the vendor, Hannum, Wagle & Cline Engineering. This is an amendment to authorize \$44,500 in additional funds to assist IMPO staff and IEDC with closing remaining projects for READI 1.0 and reallocation of remaining funds to READI 2.0, which will request additional coordination and administrative needs. The second item was for a project with the Town of Plainfield with the Echo Hollow Park. The town is improving connectivity and access with the park through trail infrastructure design, engineering, and construction. These improvements will create scenic and accessible connections throughout the park while prioritizing pedestrian and vehicle safety. The final project is with the City of Franklin with the Active Adult Center. The town is improving the center, a facility that will now meet the needs of seniors in the area and region. This includes the current building being replaced with a larger auditorium, kitchen, meeting rooms, and an added area for entertainment and games.

**7. IMPO Strategic Plan – Where we have been.**

**Anna Gremling** presented information about the Indianapolis Metropolitan Planning Organization. In 2018 it was recommended as part of the strategic plan to become an independent MPO, grow as an independent MPO and formalize the organization as regional convener. A bill passed in 2019 formalizing duties of the IMPO in Indiana Code and in June of 2020 the IMPO formally separated from the city of Indianapolis. There are four pillars of the organization, which are Convene, Inform, Plan and Fund. The vision of the IMPO allows the organization to grow in Economic Development, Housing, environmental and Data. The purpose of the MPO is to institute and maintain a comprehensive planning and programming process for transportation policy and to assist the central Indiana regional development authority in carrying out its duties.
