2. 2026-2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AMENDMENTS

Laura Drascic discussed proposed amendments to the 2026-2029 (TIP) for review. The MPO received 25 INDOT amendment requests and 5 local amendment requests. Twenty-five administrative modifications have been processed since the April meeting. Amendments were offered for public review from June 5th till the 15th. No comments were received. Q3 2026 TIP amendment requests are due via MiTIP by July 15th. An update on the 2030 Call for Projects was given. Meeting with INDOT Commissioner to determine the continuation of the Federal Exchange Program was held, IMPO staff asked for guidance by July 1st. New project selections process to go into effect at the end of this year.

STATUS UPDATES

5. IMPO STRATEGIC PLAN

Rich Overmoyer with Fourth Economy discussed the Strategic Plan. This is the second strategic plan for the IMPO. Strategic Priorities were presented. Trip took place last week to Atlanta, GA. Some of the discussion of the plan was the four pillars – convene, inform, plan and funding. The other topics presented included The Federal Planning Leadership, Internal Operations, Housing, Land Use Planning, Innovation, and Regional Technical Backbone - some of the comparisons came from the trip last week to Atlanta.

6. SAFETY ACTION PLAN UPDATE

Dan Malson with Kimley-Horn presented information about the Safety Action Plan and the associated Vision Zero Resolution. Proposed updates to the Vision Zero Resolution include changing the baseline year to 2023 and adopting a rolling 5-year average for crash monitoring; this update was supported by the Safety Steering Committee. The updated High Injury Network was presented, as was the new Vulnerable Road User Assessment which includes pedestrians and bicyclists. An additional update was given regarding Community Safety Zones (CSZs) which provide individual members with a list of priority areas to improve traffic safety in their communities. These CSZs will also be included as one of the main criteria for the Project List required for the Safety Action Plan. The Safety Action Plan will be released for public comments in July and the resolution for adoption will be presented in August 2026.

7. ANNUAL SAFETY REPORT

Andrea Miller presented an update to the Annual Safety Report. This report fulfills the tracking requirements necessary for the Safety Action Plan, monitoring progress towards the IMPO Vision Zero Goal of reducing serious and fatal crashes by 35% by 2040. The most recent information shows a reduction in serious and fatal crashes in 2025, however despite this most recent decrease currently crashes are above 2020 levels and the region is not meeting its Vision Zero Goal.

8. FEDERAL CERTIFICATION

Anna Gremling discussed the certification. We are 4-6 weeks out of receiving the final report. We are doing a August speaker series on Micromobility.
