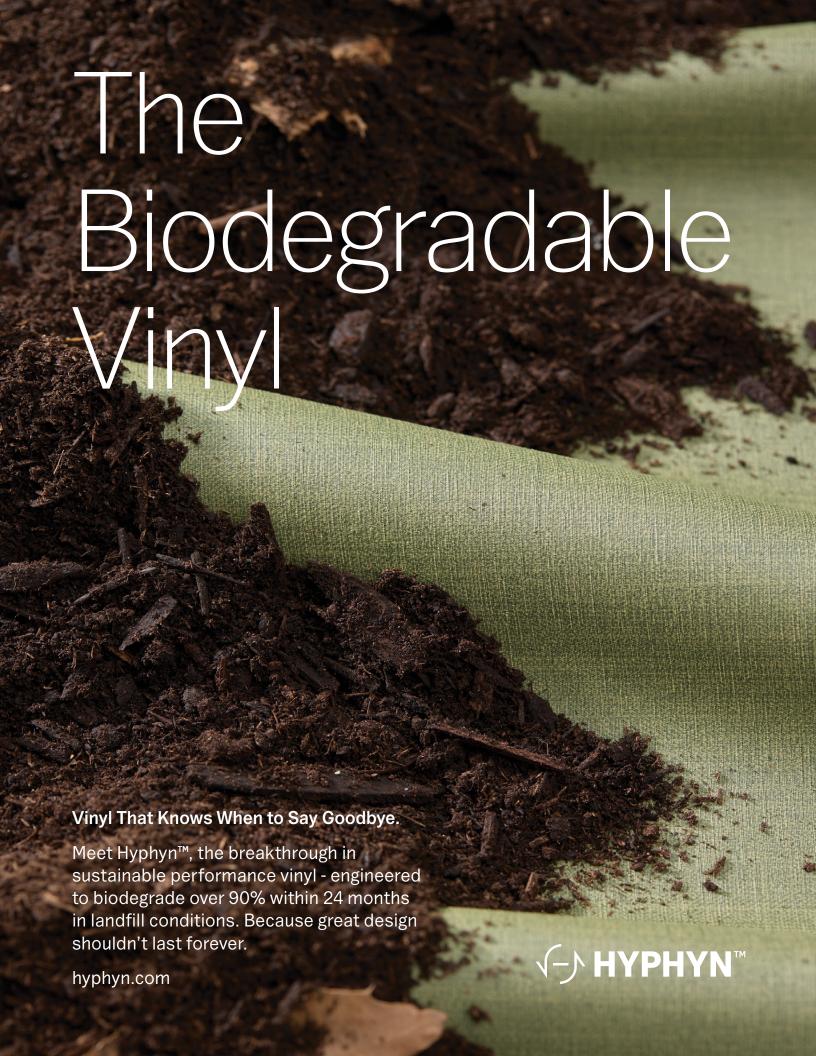

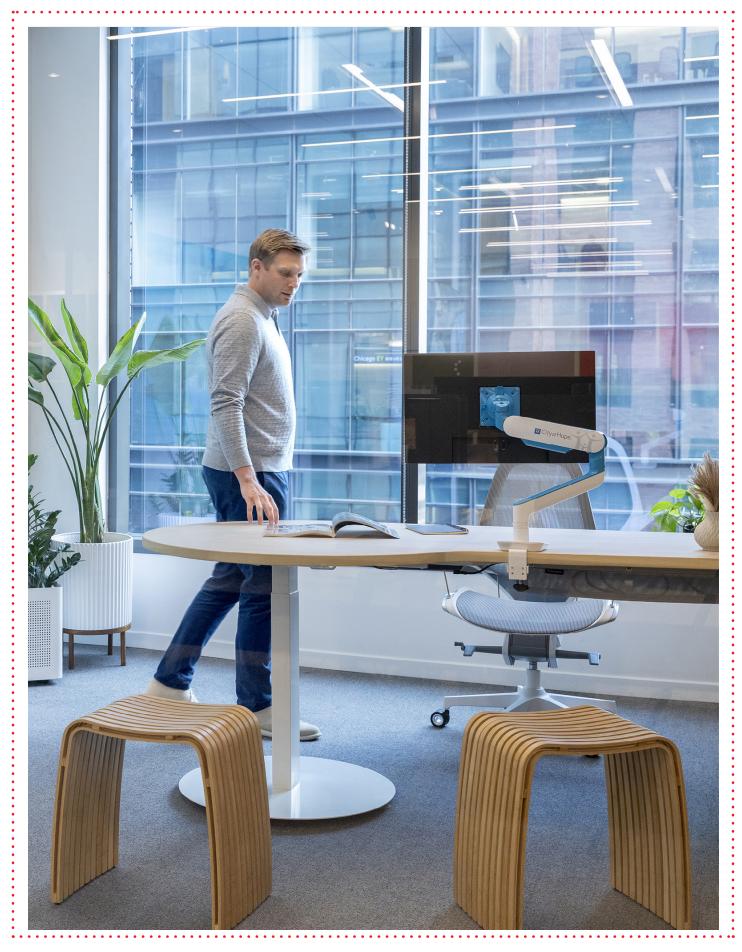

Don't Wear THIS to Your Job Interview

Dear Stephen,

I'm a sales representative for a furniture company. I like my job, but I get calls from recruiters like you (and sometimes from companies directly) about other opportunities and if the brand interests me, I always feel like I should interview.

Mostly, they are lateral moves but with better brands, however lately I've even gotten a chance to interview for one or two leadership opportunities. I'm in my mid-30s, I call on architects and designers. I like to think I dress hip but I consider myself an old soul. I wear sports jackets way more often than my colleagues. I also have some tattoos but nothing too visible.

I'm trying to get a handle on how to dress for an interview these days. I've noticed when I've interviewed with luxury Italian brands, most of the gentlemen wear ties and the women are very well-dressed as well. Yet, when I interview with companies like MillerKnoll or Steelcase, it seems no one even owns a tie. The common thread is everyone dresses nicely, and no one is too big on brands showing. But I'm always conflicted and I never feel like I'm dressed right.



Since I'm in my thirties but tend to think a little old school, I still believe when dressing for an interview, I need to get more dressed up than my everyday business attire. But it seems there's a downside to that - a recruiter shared with me that the company interviewing me recently thought I looked "too corporate."

What's the protocol on how to dress for an interview today? Either on Teams or in person? What's your advice?

Signed, Fashion Dilemma

Dear FD,

The most important thing to remember when dressing for an interview is to do your homework on how the people in the role you're interviewing for dress on a dayto-day basis. Here's how I tell people to do it: go on LinkedIn, find some people in that exact role you're interviewing for and find the manager that you would be reporting to. Doing this you can get a sense of who they are and what that person 'looks like.' Don't judge by their profile picture (which generally

always looks the same and by that I mean "professional"), first connect with them and then scroll through their thread. Usually you will see photos of them at trade shows, sales meetings, presentations, events—that is how you can get an idea of how they dress at that company. Also, if you look on their Instagram or Facebook, you may also get a sample of how they dress for work. Check X too, all it takes is a little bit of internet sleuthing.

Alternatively, in some cases, if you're dealing with an HR person first (or a recruiter) you can just ask them directly, "How should I dress?" Keep in mind, whether the interview is in person or on Teams, you should look the same. No matter how you dress in terms of clothing, here are some additional tips on how to accessorize:

Men and women should both avoid excessive jewelry. It is distracting, especially rings. Even if you're on a Teams call it can be noisy if you're tapping against the desk, for instance, with your jewelry and you might not notice it as it is a habit.

Meanwhile, if you're interviewing in person, the most common feedback I get from clients style-wise has to do with footwear. For men, in particular, wear socks – the bare ankle, loafer look is not as charming as you think it is – I once had someone pull an offer on someone who didn't wear socks to an interview. I get a lot of negative feedback, also, when candidates wear shoes that are too casual. Sketchers do not belong at a job interview! That one is not up for debate.

Tattoos are a non-issue for almost everyone, as are piercings. That being said, gratuitous face piercings are maybe not the right idea (unless you're interviewing at Trader Joes). Also, too much cologne or perfume can be a turn-off. The people interviewing you need to be able to breathe in order to ask questions!

Which reminds me, check your breath. Hygiene is important, always. When you get to an interview, go straight to the restroom. Why? Because step one when you walk in the building needs to be to look in the mirror! If you're all sweaty from getting there, wipe your face. How's your hair looking? Did you have cilantro or kale at lunch? You know – the basics. Same thing before you go online for a Teams interview. Look in the mirror, don't rely on the camera because then it's too late. Meanwhile, when you are in the restroom before your interview, go ahead and use it, so you're not fidgeting during the conversation. It may seem obvious, but you have no idea how often people forget the very very basics when it comes to interviewing.

One other thing – while you're in the restroom, turn your phone off, get your last texts out before the interview, this way you won't be tempted to look at it even while you're in the waiting room. You'll be busy locking in.

Since there is no set dress code anymore, getting dressed for an interview is now more of a challenge

than you would expect. There are so many types and versions of "professional dress" in today's workplace, getting dressed for an interview now requires research into the culture of the company you're interviewing with. Really, it could be just as simple as asking the HR person or the recruiter. Everyone gets it because every company has a different vibe, not to mention it shows respect and also that you're serious about wanting the job. I always say traditional fashion rules exist for a reason, so air on the side of tradition because everyone can appreciate a classic dresser.

One last tip – if the interviewer tells you it's casual Friday and they're dressing down, that doesn't apply to you. You don't work there, yet. It's still an interview for you!

Materials and textiles derived from nature allow spaces to broadly build upon biophilic design movements that have defined design over the past few years. Warm woods, earthcolored tones, and natural fibers are trending, signaling that sustainable design and eco-consciousness are here to stay.





to favor. The smooth and neutral elegance of the collection's organic blocks brings natural occurring colors to the forefront with a selection of rich browns, greys, and blues to choose from. The Muratto collection also introduced 100% natural preserved moss accents as a new take on texture and terrain within interiors. 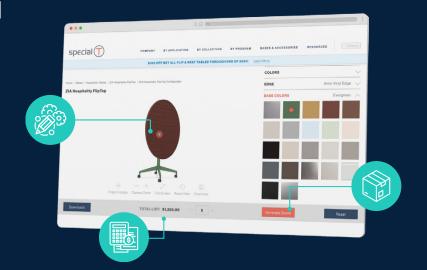

fatigue and reduce physiological stress by up to 60%, this revolutionary step in biophilic design significantly advances the power that fractal/nature-driven design can have in the interior design industry. Creating spaces that help consumers regulate their nervous system and subsequently improve their health is in line with the industry's mission to create hospitality design that promotes holistic wellness, and healing.

Playful Immersive Design

Playful and experimental colors and design blended with grown-up sophistication will gain significant traction in 2026. By incorporating kinetic and tactile elements, interiors will encourage interaction and exploration, evoking an elevated, adult sense of fun. This reflects a broader shift toward interiors that are less serious, designed instead to delight, surprise, and spark joy, much like the retro design



period of the late 20th century. We see influences of "more-is-more" ideology in the recent buzzy opening of Faena New York, a much awaited extension of the Faena brand that's revered for its vibrance and bold patterns. The luxuriously loud and bold designs in Faraway Hotels' upcoming expansions in Sag Harbour and Jackson Hole exemplify the use of world building to characterize the properties to fit the charm and personality of each location.

Momentum's Digital Art Gallery provides designers with a wealth of playful, colorful and customizable design options, such as Epic Haute Dogs and Isla Botanica, to truly amplify and transform spaces.

Momentum's Idyllwild in Wonderland-themed booth (Booth #719) at Boutique Design New York (BDNY) experiments with spirited, vivacious design. The goal was to turn the booth into an experience, aligning itself with the concept of the third space — environments meant to be enjoyed beyond home, work, or school. Amid discussions about the decline of "third spaces", there has been renewed effort in creating commercial spaces that people can truly savor. 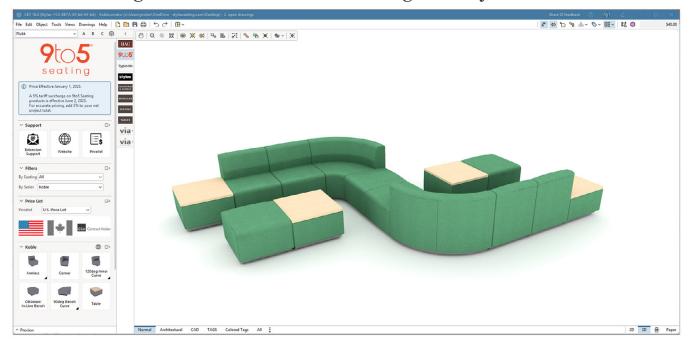

"Designing for posture is designing for choice," said Chris Heard, Principal at Hendrick. "We created a sequence of spaces that invites users to sit, stand, perch, lounge, and step outdoors—each posture supported by power, lighting, and media so teams can move seamlessly throughout the day."

The project's most visible architectural intervention is a new entry vestibule featuring a branded art moment: an origami-inspired

interpretation of the client's logo that nods to nature and the environment. This sculptural gesture anchors arrival, clarifies wayfinding, and establishes a material language of clarity and durability carried through the interiors. The vestibule's integrated digital touchpoints and branded graphics—



developed with the client's internal communications team—create a layered welcome that feels both editorial and personal.

The new space offers employees and visitors workstyle options. Flexible meeting zones shift from auditorium-style presentations to workshop tables to collaborative entertainment with minimal reset time. Integrated AV and power make each configuration equally viable. Softer seating clusters and counter-height perches support informal one-on-ones, quick standups, or solo focus—all micro-moments that keep work moving between scheduled meetings. A technology-ready rooftop terrace extends the posture palette to the open air, enabling everything from quiet heads-down work to small-group sessions under the sky.

The two-story "SO Cool" micro-market and an adjacent wellness/ fitness center are tied together by a new, modernized staircase, encouraging healthy transitions and casual collisions throughout the day. 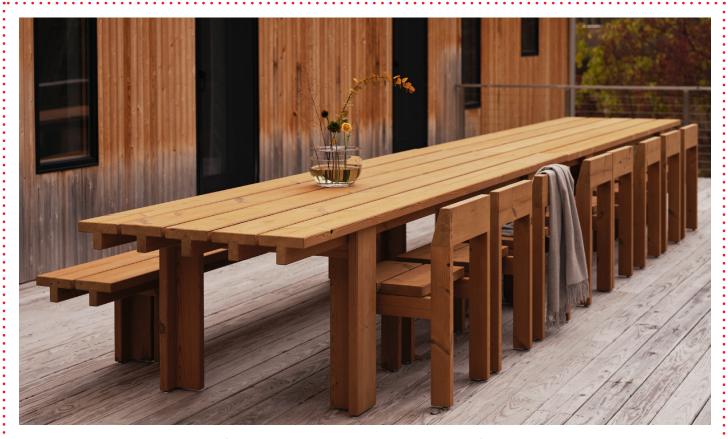

Visitors who book the Oak House will be able to unwind on the deck's outdoor furniture from Vaarnii, spin vinyl on a Wrensilva record console, enjoy Tiami mattresses outfitted with organic cotton Piaule linens, and recline on seating by Herman Miller and Fritz Hansen while the fire crackles in the wood-burning fireplace. Guests will also have the ability

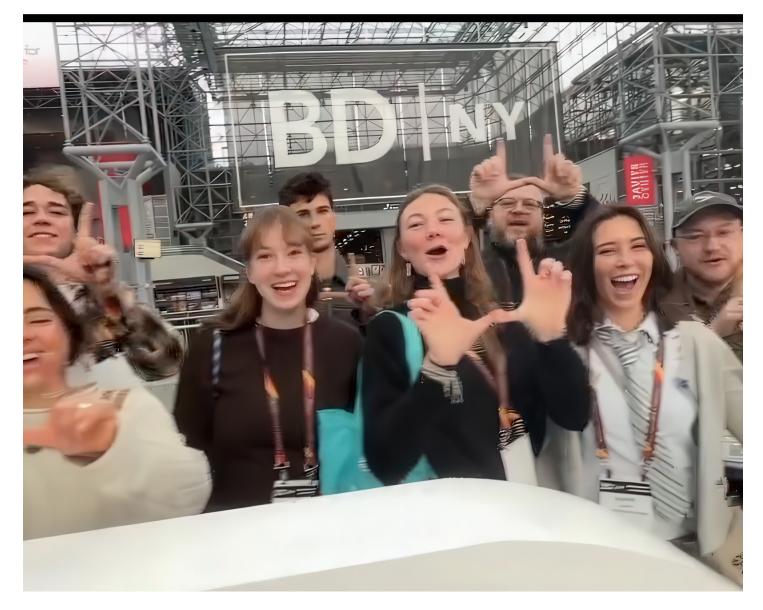
Main House:

The hotel's iconic Main House has been updated with sofas from John Pawson's Drift Collection for Herman Miller, which are expertly crafted from solid white oak and feature rich leather upholstery, along with Oak Tabouret Stools from Cassina, designed by Charlotte Perriand and originally inspired by the three-legged milking stools used by shepherds in the Alps.

"We have always admired the restraint and refinement of John Pawson's work and it is one of our biggest design inspirations, so using his pieces in the space was a no-brainer — especially because they are made in solid white oak, the primary wood we use in our designs, and the hotel itself is nestled into a mature oak forest," says McHugh. "When we are so closely linked to both the source material and the finished product, a deeper gratitude for those earthly gifts arises. We have used antique milking stools throughout the hotel since opening, so introducing Perriand's Tabouret stools alongside them also emphasizes that relationship between reference and result."

Again, the selection of the pieces throughout the property takes cues from the building's surroundings, the white oak forest. The context lends the pieces a greater importance: the source of their beauty and strength is just outside. **BoF**





Why BDNY Matters More Than Ever to the Contract Market

By the time doors opened at the Javits Center on November 9, it was clear that Boutique Design New York (BDNY) was no longer just a hospitality show. Instead, it's become a barometer for how experience-driven design is shaping every corner of the built environment inside and out. With more than 700 exhibitors filling the aisles and a surge of contract-adjacent brands (including more than 100 first-timers), this year's show underscored the growing influence of hospitality on workplace, multifamily, and commercial environments with immersive installations, expanded pavilions, and a conference lineup packed with nearly 40 CEU sessions, signaling a continued evolution of materials, technologies, and spatial concepts.

It's All About Exteriors

This year's edition didn't just present new products, it also reflected a market adjusting itself around comfort, narrative, flexibility, and human experience. Many of the designers, manufacturers, and specifiers on the show floor echoed that sentiment, noting how the boundaries between

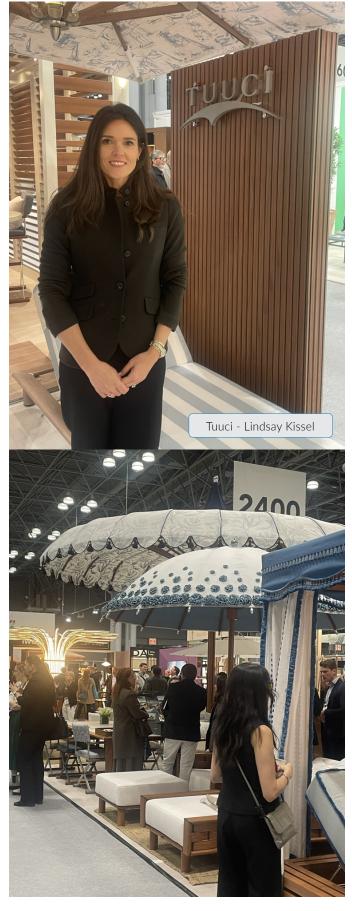

sectors continue to dissolve and how hospitality-level aesthetics are increasingly expected across commercial environments. A prime example? The outdoor furniture space. Business of Furniture resident columnist Stephen Viscusi notes as much. "I think I saw more outdoor furniture companies than ever before, followed by tile and stone," he says. "The highlight of the show was seeing the Tuuci umbrella booth. It's the boutique hit of the show with the most outstanding design of any products this year. Each of their umbrellas knows how to gild the lily, and they now have cabanas that are the height of luxury."

We caught up with the company's Chief Marketing Officer Mausi McDaniel who talked about the company's current marketing efforts. "One of our themes this year is creating a story through product that focuses a lot on brand expression, whether that's your personal brand or the hospitality experience that someone is having," she explains, "so you can see some things go a little bit more whimsical, some more sophisticated, it just depends on what kind of experience people are looking



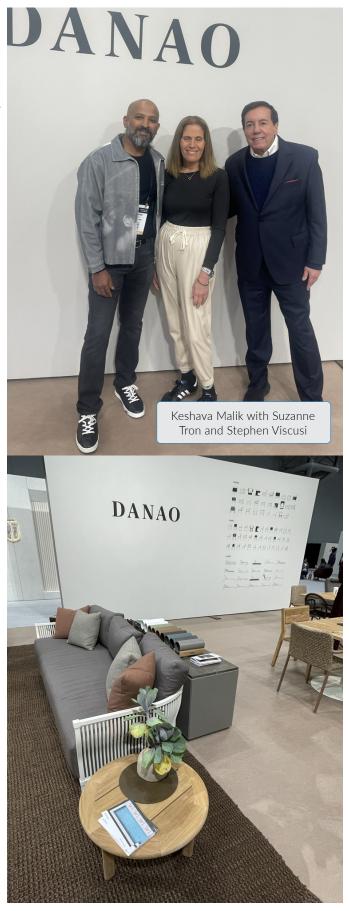
to have. Overall we've heard from people that they really want to live their best lives outdoors. We want our products to be a part of that, not just exist within the spaces."

Some product examples from Senior Vice President Management & Design Lindsay Kissel, ranged from the new Canyon Crue Collection, a customizable fresh take on a director's chair offered in dining, counter, and bar height, to the Bolero Parasol in Ombré Blossom, featuring a round shape and whimsical feel (blossoms optional). "We have 336 hand-tufted blossoms on there—varying in size—and on the inside, we have these beautiful, scalloped detailing," Kissel says. "This creates an interesting interior experience too; it's strong on top of being beautiful with 16 ribs up there. This one we are offering in 9 and 12 feet. There may be a smaller one at some point or a bigger one." Both were Best of BDNY 2025 product winners, by the way.



Another outdoor brand making its mark with a prime spot on the floor and an impressive product range was Danao. They were "the underestimated designs of the outdoor furniture space," Viscusi says, and "a must-see that belongs in every hotel and cruise line." We caught up briefly with Vice President & Chief Information Officer Keshava Malik, who was relishing the corner placement of his booth. "The show has been fabulous for us, very busy. All of the right people that we wanted to meet, we're getting the chance to see them," he said. "They're able to see all our new products, so it's been a very good response. It makes me very thankful to curate this kind of space." Among the new releases were the Lungomare Collection. "We took a traditional style and gave a modern flair to it." Designed by DANAO Studio, it features a sleek aluminum frame and a subtle, inviting curve in the backrest and is paired with plush cushions for exceptional comfort.

As traffic picked up across the show floor, that crossover became even clearer. Conversations with designers, product developers, and brand leaders repeatedly returned to the same point: Clients across sectors, from workplace



to mixed-use and multifamily, are asking for the same things hospitality has been perfecting for years. Elevated comfort. Stronger material narratives. Flexible environments that blur work, socializing, and relaxation. In fact, that's something Haworth is leading the way on. "When the Chief Executive Officer of Haworth Lifestyle, Dario Rinero, acquired Janus et Cie, it was one of the smartest purchases in the industry. Their booth was packed, and I think they're one of the largest domestic outdoor furniture companies in the United States. A smart addition to the Haworth portfolio, for



sure," Viscusi says. "Just as smart is Haworth bringing on Bill Ward of Restoration Hardware. I know he'll do for Janus et Cie what he's done for RH; he was part of Gary Friedman's inner circle."

As the new Chief Executive Officer of Janus et Cie, Ward was delighted to be at the show with a number of new products. "It's a great way to lay up the opening of our new season," he says. "It's a great show and it's interesting to see how the outdoor sector has grown and the array of competition that's out there." This led to discussion on the contract market, with so many companies developing spaces outside to enhance the visitor and worker experience. "We have a lot of crossover and collaboration between our contract and hospitality teams," he continues. "One of the unique identifiers for Janus is that we have this multi-sector approach." And with its customer-centric focus, the Janus team is

committed to serving up a frictionless, delightful, and joyful experience for consumers. "If you don't serve the customer, someone else will, right? I tell my team we sell happiness; it's at the core of anything really," he adds. "In the design business you are trying to connect with an emotion." In fact. at Janus, it's all about creating an environment where people can shed whatever's dragging them down that day and provide them with a space where they can be their best. One product at BDNY that definitely fit the bill was Janus' new Sun Lounger. "Feedback from our clients has been really positive." Also on hand was



Plume, a recent collection by designer Patrick Norguet and the stylish, portable Moonflower alabaster lights. Come January, anticipate even more excitement from the brand with the introduction of a big round of launches. "In 2026 we have at least a dozen full collections coming, 15 line extensions, and some new categories," Ward reveals. "We're approaching 50 years in the business, and people keep coming back for a reason."

It's All About Immersive Experiences

From the four immersive Designed Spaces to the expanded Dine & Design Pavilion, the show also leaned heavily into multisensory exploration and branded storytelling. It's an approach with growing relevance for contract furniture makers navigating clients who now prioritize ambiance, wellness, and user engagement just as heavily as durability or cost. In fact, using storytelling as a commercial blueprint, the Designed Spaces featured four conceptual environments created by leading firms that functioned as living case studies in sensory storytelling. They included: "The



Alchemist" by Aria Group, a reflective, mixed-metal bar concept exploring transformation and perception, illustrating how front-of-house dining spaces can create emotional impact through material play; "Châlet Après" by Mazzarini & Co in partnership with Apartments by Marriott Bonvoy and BHDM Design, an upscale reimagining of the alpine retreat, packed with texture-focused detailing that speaks directly to hospitality-adjacent multifamily amenities; "The Splash Pad" by DREAM Hotels × Nivek Remas, a kinetic, poolside-inspired lounge, offering cues for how social spaces in workplace and student housing can adopt hospitality's energy-forward approach; and "Midnight Garden" by DesignAgency, a meditative dreamscape that demonstrates how lighting, shadow, and motion can differentiate brand environments without relying on heavy architectural intervention.



I mention this element of the show this year based on my first-hand experience with the one of the sessions. I moderated the talk about "Midnight Garden," which proved insightful on a number of levels, particularly the importance of making a space inviting and inspiring from multiple viewpoints by providing those who visited a range of experiences to embrace throughout the day. For contract furniture makers, these spaces illustrated how hospitality's immersive, experiential approach is shaping expectations for lobbies, lounges, and mixed-use social zones as well as workplace gathering spaces.



Some major themes apparent on both the show floor and the conference included the ongoing push toward wellness and human-centered



design including noise management, sensory modulation, and biophilic elements; the rise of "quiet luxury" in commercial settings with the use of softer materials like plush upholstery, rounded forms, and warm neutrals; material transparency through recycled content, repairable components, and energy-efficient manufacturing practices that advance sustainability and circularity efforts while simultaneously delivering long-term durability; and of course, the ever-growing curiosity around how best to implement AI when developing concept and design, operations, personalization, and more. While AI has not yet disrupted the furniture design and manufacturing sector significantly, most of us are still wondering how it might shape the next generation and contract environments overall. In addition, flexibility remains non-negotiable postpandemic, and we're not just talking about how it relates to a return to the office. The demand for product development focused on modular seating, reconfigurable tables, mobile partitions, and adaptive lighting remain high on everyone's wish list to address hybrid work models, multi-use spaces, and even amenity programming.

It's All About Authenticity Too

We'd be remiss not to mention the importance of authenticity in brand storytelling too, and a visit to Samuelson Furniture really brought that home for us. Fourth-generation, family-owned Samuelson, which celebrated its 90th anniversary this year, marked the occasion with curated booths (hospitality and senior living) that took visitors on a tour through nine decades of the company's innovation and most recent product launch. The museum-style setup showcased the company's evolution in a memorable way with original chair concepts, patented technological enhancement development, and current launches of the Muriel Reclining Chair and the

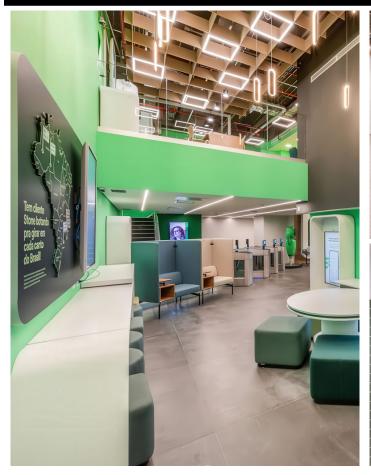


premiere of the Happy Chair, a new wall-hugger recliner developed to help seniors get in and out of the chair with ease. "This [presentation] is like love letter to us. We pulled out pieces that are archival, and some of these items that you're seeing are 50 or 60 plus years old," says Samuelson President Michael Chalfin. "It speaks to a heritage and different items we created and brought to market over the last 90 years. We have French traditional represented, Art Nouveau, arts and crafts, and modern." One of the things that makes the company so unique, he adds, is that they are manufacturers as opposed to many competitors who are buyers and sellers. "So I think this particular setup has really drawn a lot of people," he adds. "I see people gravitating towards the furniture and saying, 'Is this a new model?' And I tell them actually it's not. We can make it for you, of course. I think people aren't used to seeing us present this way.

Most people are used to seeing us with a heavy case presentation." Along with a different presentation, the museum feel definitely piqued visitors' curiosity. "We have podiums and write ups that are telling our story as it's woven through the booth, which I think is really the self-selling moment. People are coming in and they're able to get the vibe of what we're all about and what we brought to the table through self-exploration. We've had a great reception to the whole thing."

For contract furniture professionals, BDNY 2025 offered more than hospitality inspiration, it provided a preview of the broader market's trajectory. Experience is no longer an add-on; it is becoming the baseline expectation across every sector. As hospitality brands push deeper into sensory storytelling, wellness, and material nuance, their influence continues to ripple into commercial interiors, workplace strategy, multifamily amenities, and even residential product development. BDNY's 2025 edition made one thing unmistakably clear to us: The future of contract design is increasingly shaped by hospitality thinking, and the brands that embrace this convergence are positioning themselves ahead of the next wave of client demand. World's Tallest Student Residences Tower Over Manhattan, As BDB Transforms Financial District Hotel

◆ Continuing an unbroken track record of major speed-to-market successes, construction leader and expert in adaptive reuse BDB Construction Enterprise has announced its transformation of a high-rise hotel into new student residences in New York's Financial District.

The tower at 99 Washington Street — formerly a 492-key hotel recognized as the Holiday Inn flag's tallest worldwide — has opened its first phase, now housing students and interns from nearby universities. The highly innovative, 650-bed dormitory complex is cited by CTBUH as a record-setting structure: At 50 stories and



485 feet tall, it is the tallest student accommodation in the world.

Led by Tallal Bhutta, founder and CEO of BDB Construction, the targeted reconstruction and conversion of the 142,000-square-foot property for owner-developer FOUND Study brings new finishes, cabinetry and fixtures to all its rooms and common areas. A reimagining of shared spaces and amenities to better serve a student resident population, currently underway, will be complete later in 2025, with FOUND Study FiDi offering occupants a communal kitchen and dining areas, laundry rooms, lounges, shared study zones, and a fitness center.



"Our approach to repositioning projects of this kind moves them as quickly as possible to occupancy, allowing the owners to reach their revenue phase early," says BDB's Bhutta, who holds advanced degrees in construction management and structural and civil engineering. "Converting the hotel tower at 99 Washington Street into student residences is being completed in two discrete phases, so they achieved occupancy for about half of the 650 planned beds before this fall semester started."

Bhutta notes that the remaining transformation includes a creative conversion of an adjacent chapel building as shared amenity space, set to open in 2026.

"We accomplish this kind of speed to market by being involved in the earliest planning phases and contributing to decision-making, so that all stakeholders and trades are aligned on goals, process, and schedule," adds Bhutta.

A National Campaign for Student Housing

As students nationwide are challenged to find affordable, convenient highquality residential offerings in major cities, BDB Construction Enterprise is at work nationally readying new and renovated offerings to supplement existing dormitories, says Bhutta.

While working on 99 Washington Street, BDB Construction Enterprise has also completed a major renovation of a 75-student apartment building in Berkeley, California, representing a national expansion and the company's first West Coast project. The new FOUND Study Downtown Berkeley, which includes private and shared suites with in-home appliances and en suite bathrooms, was completed in just six weeks, says Bhutta.

Other projects underway include a dormitory-style redevelopment of University Centre in Newark, New Jersey. BDB Construction has also recently completed major conversion projects in Midtown Manhattan and in Providence, Rhode Island.

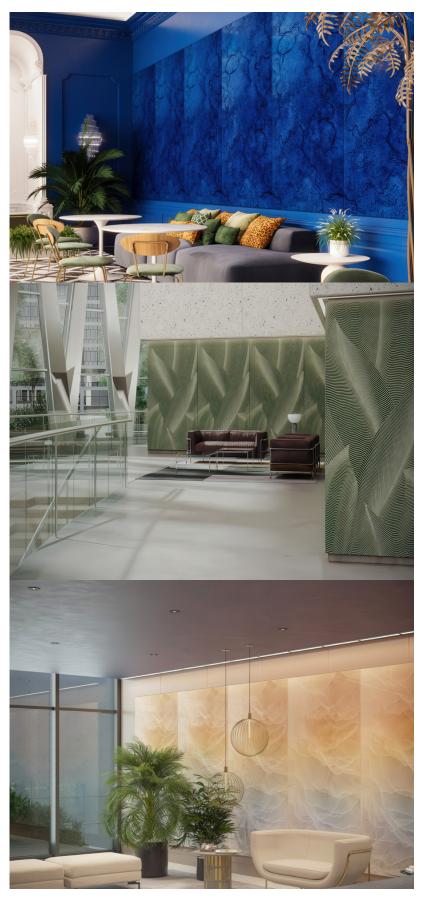

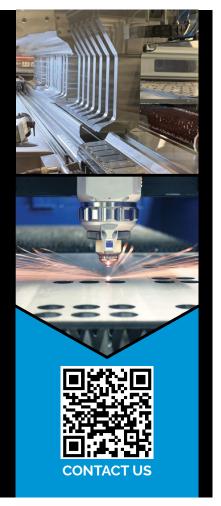

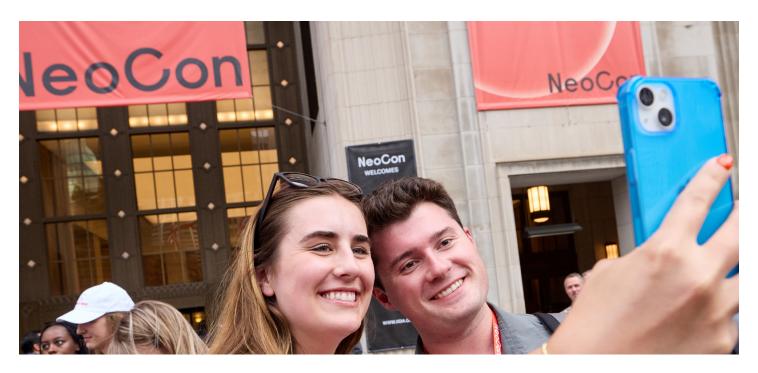
