Lisa Furr is the Program Manager for the National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL), a project of End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin (End Abuse). In her role at NCALL, she provides nationwide leadership, technical assistance, and training to professionals across the country on various topics related to abuse in later life, including creating and enhancing coordinated community response (CCR) and systems change. She also assists in the development of training materials and resources related to abuse in later life.

Prior to coming to NCALL, Furr worked as the Project Manager at the Virginia Office of Attorney General where she assisted with programming initiatives related to domestic violence and sexual assault specifically working on the sexual assault kit testing initiative and implementing the Lethality Assessment Program. Furr also collaborated with statewide partners in Virginia to coordinate and deliver training and technical assistance on working with victims from underserved populations, including African Americans, elderly victims, and victims with limited English proficiency. For ten years, she served on the board of Virginia Coalition for the Prevention of Elder abuse, as its chair and conference committee chair.

Furr has over thirty years' experience in group dynamics, training, and diversity. She holds a Master's degree from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education. Furr lives and works in Richmond, Virginia.
