3. Using the primary source, freewrite about what you see. (3-8)
4. Write a narrative from a perspective you see in the primary source you are observing. (6-12)
5. Using the primary source, write in different formats such as a poem or all dialogue.
6. What do you think the people you see in the primary source are thinking? (3-8)
7. After observing the primary source, what do you think happened before and after? (3-8)
8. After observing the primary source, what emotional cues are the people in it providing? (6-12)
9. After observing the primary source, what do you not see that you think should be there? (6-12)
10. Describe what you have learned about the author of the primary source by observing the primary source. (6-12)
11. After observing the primary source, speculate on the audience. (6-12)
12. After observing the primary source, what questions remain or additional information would you need? (6-12)
