<b>Medical Dental Vision</b>	<p>If enrolled, active medical, dental and vision coverage ends at the end of the month in which your last day worked occurs.</p> <p>Note: You will receive COBRA information from the Rockwell Alight Service Center (RASC).</p> <p><b>Example:</b> Last Day of Work: Mar. 15, Last Day of Coverage: Mar. 31st</p>	<p>You become eligible to elect COBRA coverage on the first day of the month following your termination date.</p> <p>The maximum COBRA eligibility period is 18 months. You may elect or decline medical, dental and vision COBRA coverage. If you elect coverage, you pay for your medical, dental or vision coverage at the COBRA rate (102% of the total premium, shown in the Appendix) during your COBRA period. The Rockwell Alight Service Center (RASC) administers COBRA.</p> <p>The Working Spouse/Domestic Partner Adjustment is not continued if you elect COBRA. Health Management incentive credit ends at the end of the month in which you terminate your active employment.</p> <p>All premiums will be billed monthly by the RASC at the full COBRA rate and may be paid by credit card, direct debit, or check. The RASC will mail your COBRA rights notification to your home address on file. Please read this document carefully.</p> <p><b>Alternatively</b>, if you meet the following criteria at termination:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You are at least age 55 but not yet 65, and</li> <li>You have at least 10 years of service, and</li> <li>Your age plus years of service total 75 or more,</li> </ul> <p>You may be eligible to enroll for coverage in the Retiree Medical Plan on the first of the month following your termination date.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Certain employees are not eligible to participate in the Rockwell Automation Retiree Medical Plan. The options available and their cost may differ from those you had while employed. Your HSA account is portable, which means you keep this account balance, or you may move it to another HSA account provider. Funds in your HSA can be used for unreimbursed medical expenses under any future medical plan, including the retiree HSA Medical option.  You can also use your HSA account to pay COBRA premiums. The employer HSA contributions will end as of your last day of employment.	No action required. If you keep the account with Health Equity, a monthly service fee and other applicable fees are automatically deducted from your account by Health Equity.  Health Equity will provide details after your employment ends. You can also request that HealthEquity send a check for the remaining account balance directly to another HSA administrator. If you are enrolled in a Health Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA) on your last day worked, you may continue coverage through COBRA for the duration of the calendar year in which you terminate employment by paying the same amount that you were having deducted from your pay, but on an after-tax basis. The RASC will send a COBRA notice within 2 weeks following your termination.  Expenses incurred through the end of the month in which you stopped working, or the end of your COBRA continuation period if applicable, are eligible for reimbursement.	To continue coverage under COBRA, you must call the RASC to enroll within 60 days of the last day of the month in which your employment terminates or the date you receive your COBRA notice, whichever is later. <b>Legacy Health Reimbursement Account (HRA)</b>	Active plan participation ends the last day of the month in which your employment terminates (your last day worked).	Employees with HRA balances at the end of 2022 had those accounts moved to HealthEquity for use through <b>December 31, 2025</b> , or until their Rockwell Automation medical plan participation ends, whichever comes first.  If you continue coverage in a Rockwell Automation health plan through COBRA or retiree medical and have a remaining HRA balance, then you will be permitted to continue spending down your HRA balance until the earliest of the date you exhaust that balance, the date retiree medical coverage for you and your eligible dependents ends, or through <b>Dec. 31, 2025</b> . You may delay election of benefit until earliest retirement: (i) the date that you attained age 55 with at least ten years of service; or (ii) the date that your age plus service is at least 75, with at least ten years of service. Or you may defer election until normal retirement date (age 65). If you are age 65 or older when your employment ends, your benefit must start first of month following last day worked.</p> <p>Participants may elect monthly annuity or lump sum benefit payment options. Your grant date and your last day PAID are important dates for LTI awards.	<p>Terminating your employment for any reason will affect your stock options. In all terminations, if your last day paid is less than one year from grant date, your option award is forfeited.</p> <p>If you are terminated for cause, all options are immediately forfeited. If you do not qualify as retired (see below) or terminated for cause, you will have three months after your last day paid, including severance pay, to exercise any VESTED options and UNVESTED options are forfeited on your last day paid.</p> <p>You are considered retired for stock option purposes if as of your last day paid (including severance if applicable), you are: (1) at least age 55 with at least 10 years of service, or (2) at least age 65 with at least 5 years of service. If you qualify as retired and you retire twelve or more months after the grant date, you have the lesser of five years or the remaining term of the options to exercise your options. Options continue to vest in retirement according to the vest schedule of your award (i.e., most commonly 1/3 per year).</p> <p>Any expiration or cancellation of stock option rights will be subject to all terms and conditions of the Stock Option Agreement. As always, you are responsible for monitoring the expiration date of your options.
