Established in 2010 by Rachel Wilkins Patel to raise awareness about the need to encourage girls to pursue 21st-century digital careers, HER Ideas programs have impacted girls across Northeast Ohio by providing the opportunity to learn from women working in technology fields. CAL is now the home to these programs and workshops for girls in 5th-8th grades to explore animation, coding, film making, and game design.

The goals of SHE Creates Mentors are:

1. To mentor and educate youth about career options in STEM/STEAM fields.
2. To support and guide CAL staff in developing and strengthening programming to achieve CAL's mission.
3. To advocate for CAL's mission and promote CAL programming across Northeast Ohio.

Mentors are engaged through:

- Attending SHE Creates quarterly meetings to learn more about CAL programming and educational initiatives as well as plan and improve STEAM programming.
- Offering informed and critical feedback and support to CAL staff regarding new and developing programs and partnerships.
- Leading and assisting with STEAM workshops including STEAM Saturdays.

- Professional background in a tech-related field
