#### Seagull Mama by Kathie diStefano



#### Introduction



**Seagull Mama**, performed by Kathie diStefano, an American/Dutch actress, teacher, and former clown, teaches why litter is a problem for our environment and the importance of recycling. In this 'introduction to theater' the youngest audiences can enjoy a fun theatrical experience while learning about the importance of good trash behavior. Ms Kathie incorporates physical comedy, a Dutch Sing-A-Long and audience participation to entertain, while teaching her audiences how to take care of our environment.

#### **Performance Description**

Ms. Kathie opens with a short talk about trash and recycling. This interactive show takes young audience members on a journey through the eyes of a seagull mamma who mistakes trash for fish while hunting for food for her young. How do our waterways get so polluted with plastic trash? The term 'plastic soup' is introduced; lakes, rivers, and seas that have so much plastic trash that no fish can live there.

The presentation incorporates physical theatre techniques to provide comic relief. Learning through laughter is Ms. Kathie's favorite way of introducing theatre to young audience members while sharing important social messages. In the show finale, Ms. Kathie teaches the audience a Dutch song from the country she immigrated to 35 years ago. 'The Garbage Song' is included in this teacher's guide.

#### **Artist Bio:**

Kathie enjoys sharing cultural stories and trash management facts about her Dutch homelands with American audiences. Her cross cultural work began with 'HabourTraces,' a collaboration with the Baltimore Rotterdam Sister City Committee in 2014. Her performance includes a 'show and tell' portion where a series of "Welcome To The Netherlands" slides are shown while Ms Kathie speaks about where the Netherlands is, Dutch culture and what the Dutch are most famous for.

She has been awarded the 'Leaders For A Living Planet' award by the World Wildlife Fund for her educational and community outreach work in Rotterdam, the Netherlands where she resides.

Kathie also has extensive experience performing and teaching improvisational theater, inspired by the work of Keith Johnstone, Loose Moose Theater in Calgary, Canada. Kathie graduated as a drama/dance major from Bard College in upstate New York.

#### **Pre-Performance Activities:**

Classroom discussion where the following questions are addressed:

- What is litter?
- Where do you see litter?
- Why is litter a problem?
- What is 'recycling'?
- What kinds of garbage cans are recycled?
- Listen to 'The Garbage Song' located in this Teacher's Guide. Ms Kathie shares the original Dutch version of this song with the audience before The Garbage Song sing-a-long portion of the show, including movements that the audience can do from their seats.

#### **Post-Performance Activities:**

- Create a 'mini recycling center' in the classroom. Have different boxes or containers to hold various recyclable materials. For example: paper, cans, plastic, cardboard. See the 'Recycling in Baltimore City Guide' for inspiration, which can be found in the teacher's guide materials.
- Sing 'The Garbage Song', located in this teacher's guide, with the movements that were taught during the show. There is also a Garbage Song Poster with the lyrics included in this teacher's guide.
- Read 'Tom the Tulip & Eve the Sunflower' comic strip with the class, more information about this lesson can be found in this teacher's guide.
- Invite the children in the class to make a pledge to try and always throw trash away where it belongs.
- Organize a cleanup nearby school, to rid the area around school of litter.
   Tip: contact the local trash company for trash grabbers for your cleanup event.

#### **Classroom Discussion Questions:**

- Ask the class if they know of places where there is a lot of trash. We call them 'trash hotspots'.
- Ask what can we do to reduce litter?
- Ask students how they feel when they see trash in their community.


#### **Lesson Suggestion:**

#### Tom the Tulip & Eve the Sunflower comic strip about litter in nature, in this teacher's guide

- Tom the Tulip & Eve the Sunflower can be projected onto a screen while being read out loud to the children. Midway through the story, on page 9, is a moment where a classroom discussion can be held about litter in nature and/or litter in our neighborhoods.
- Finish the drawing by adding to Tom & Eve's world.
- The illustrations in this comic strip are simple, leaving lots of space for children to add to the drawing. The individual pages can be printed out for children to draw on, adding their ideas and stories to the landscape in Tom the Tulip and Eve the Sunflower's world. Once completed the children can share their personalized drawings with a fellow classmate.
- Students read the story out loud.
- Some teachers print out the individual comic strip pages and hand them out to students. Standing in front of the class, or gathered audience, a group of about 8-12 students, each holding 'their' page, take turns reading out their lines. It is a simple exercise that involves reading and presentation skills.
- This comic strip can be acted out by students as written, or the story can be expanded upon incorporating student ideas. All kinds of variations can be created when children take the Tom the Tulip & Sunflower Eve characters and 'play' with the storyline.




# The story of Sally the Sunflower & Tom the Tulip




### Sally and Tom are best friends.


You can always find them together.




## They play catch.




### They like to seesaw.




# After playing they needed a rest, so they decided a nap was best.



# After a nice long nap they woke up refreshed, ready for more fun and games.




# But when they looked around, they were shocked at what they saw. What was going on? There was garbage everywhere!




Tom the Tulip and Sally the Sunflower decided to investigate.

should go over and talk to them."




## Tom the Tulip and Sally the Sunflower went to talk to the children.




What do you think they said?


## They quickly cleaned the mess up together. They threw all the garbage away where it belonged.




Once the garbage was all cleaned up, Sally the Sunflower and Tom the Tulip and the children were happy again.
