Dr. Levine is a member of APsaA, PINE and the Contemporary Freudian Society, on the editorial Board of the IJP and Psychoanalytic Inquiry, editor-in-chief of the Routledge Wilfred Bion Studies Book Series and in private practice in Brookline, Massachusetts. He has authored many articles, book chapters, and reviews on psychoanalytic process and technique and the treatment of primitive personality disorders. His co-edited books include *Unrepresented States and the Construction of Meaning* (Karnac 2013); *On Freud's Screen Memories* (Karnac 2014); *The Wilfred Bion Tradition* (Karnac 2016); *Bion in Brazil* (Karnac 2017) and *André Green Revisited: Representation and the Work of the Negative* (Karnac 2018).

ABOUT THE DAY: André Green was a brilliant thinker and innovative contributor to our field. The fire of his ideas ignited a passion for discovery in so many colleagues: those who knew him personally as analyst, supervisor and teacher or heard his lectures and read his texts. He has been sorely missed since his death in 2012, but his thoughts continue to instruct and inspire.

Green was a leading voice in French psychoanalysis, one whose contributions sit at a crossroads, where the challenges posed and the opportunities presented by the work of Lacan, Klein, Winnicott and Bion meet the still generative insights of Freud, many of which Green reminds us have yet to be fully appreciated or developed. While Green had much to say about classical analysis and the treatment of neurosis, some of his greatest contributions were made at the points of what were once thought of as the limits of analyzability.

Like so many of us, he struggled to expand the reach of our theory and practice to patients whose difficulties lay beyond the spectrum of neurotic disturbances that classical psychoanalysis was originally intended to address. On this weekend, we will continue Green's attempts to understand and explore the work of the negative, the Dead Mother complex, the tension between presence and absence, loss and remainder, the creative, dialectical arc between them and their role in psychic development and the analytic process.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To distinguish the different levels of psychic organization between neurosis and non-neurotic structures (primitive personality disorders, psychosis, psychosomatic states, perversions, addictions, etc.).
- 2. To distinguish the differences in listening stance and technique required to work with and treat non-neurotic patients.
- 3. To understand the intricacies and subtleties of the dead mother syndrome and their implications for treatment.
- 4. To understand the intricacies and subtleties of the work of the negative and their implications for treatment.

Directions to the UVM Alumni House


From Interstate 89, Take Exit 14W into Burlington.
